Recent Achievements

Since our foundation in 1991, COMMSSA has facilitated nearly 80 episodes of care in Perth. In collaboration with SACIM-Australia, we have also financed the treatment of approximately 30 children from underprivileged families in private hospitals in Mauritius since 2016.

Finally, we want to remind everyone that our charity relies on the kindness and support of our community. If you are able to donate your time or resources, please do not hesitate to reach out to us.



Medical Directors' Report



SACIM in Mauritius (1968), SACIM-Australia in Melbourne (1973) and COMMSSA in Perth, Western Australia (1991) share a common objective: to make a difference in the lives of disadvantaged children, primarily from Mauritius and Rodrigues.

Over the years, SACIM has referred more than 750 children overseas for complex, often life-saving surgical procedures that could not be performed in Mauritius. Many of those children were treated in Australia. Between 1991and 2020, COMMSSA financed, fully or partially close to 80 episodes of care in Australia for children from poor Mauritian families.

2015, saw a game-changing development in paediatric care in Mauritius. Based primarily in private hospitals and clinics, a team led by Doctor Kevin Teerovengadum (paediatric surgeon) and Doctor Ryad Joomye (intensivist, neonatal care paediatrician) started providing first class surgical and medical care for children who, previously, would have had to be sent overseas. Not only was that care being provided at much lower cost than in Australia, but with it came the additional benefit to the child that he or she could recover in a hospital bed surrounded by family, friends and people speaking a familiar language.

In November 2016, Dr Teerovengadum and Dr Joomye, from Wellkin Hospital in Moka, requested COMMSSA's financial assistance for 25 cases. It was impossible for us to come to the aid of that many children. Nevertheless, between January 2017 and December 2019, COMMSSA's financial assistance of just over \$100,000 - topped up by contributions from SACIM Australia in some cases - helped make a difference in the life of twelve of those children.

Since 2020, despite the drastic brake that COVID-19 put on COMMSSA's activities in Perth, the Association has disbursed close to AUD 65,000 in aid to SEVEN more children in need who were treated in Mauritius.

In FY 2020-2021:

\$16,000 for a 16-year-old boy requiring bowel Surgery and \$7,000 for a 13-year-girl needing a cardiac intervention.

In FY 2021-2022:

\$3,000 for Knee surgery on a 12-year-old boy.

In FY 2022-2023:

\$9,000 for hip surgery on a 22-year-old who had had previous hip surgery in Perth in his early teens, and \$7,000 for knee surgery for 21year-old boy.

In FY 2023-2024:

\$10,000 for renal surgery required by a 4-year-old boy; \$9,000 for a 10-year-old boy with renal failure.

The sum of approximately \$165,000 that allowed COMMSSA to make a difference in the lives of NINETEEN children by having them operated on in Mauritius, would have hardly been enough to bring TEN of them to Perth for treatment.

In addition to the assistance provided to children being treated in Mauritius, COMMSSA has continued to be of assistance to three patients from Rodrigues.

L. A., a 14-year-old boy has to travel to Reunion Island with his mother every six months, for ongoing management of a malignant condition. COMMSSA pay their airfares and board and lodging.

M S. F., and her younger brother, J.F. are the only patients who have come to Perth in the past five years. They arrived in February 2023 - their seventh visit since 2010, for a long overdue review of their ocular, metabolic, endocrinological and orthopaedic conditions. COMMSSA took care of all their expenses, including an additional eye prosthesis for M S. F. and orthotics for J F. F. On two occasions since 2023, their mother has had to purchase new spectacles for them in Rodrigues. She was refunded by COMMSSA.

However, beyond the ad hoc assistance and support for surgical and medical care to disadvantaged children, we believe that COMMSSA's most important achievement is to have identified and addressed the pressing need for the training of Stoma Care Nurses in Mauritius. Although, M S. F. and her brother J F. F., were the only patients to come to Perth for treatment between 2020 and 2025, it should be obvious to all that COMMSSA has not faltered in the mission it embarked upon in 1991.

Yet, because they can no longer see, meet or even host a child who is the beneficiary of their unfailing and generous support to COMMSSA over many years, some of our members have questioned whether COMMSSA is still relevant. Why raise funds when so few children being sent to Perth?



Mauritius is often seen primarily as a beautiful island paradise. However, beneath the surface, and despite the great strides made in healthcare in the country, many children still face significant medical challenges that can affect their quality of life - a mobility handicap, visual impairment, Type 1 Diabetes and many other conditions that do not necessarily demand the sums required for costly surgical or medical interventions.

We strongly believe that, even from afar, COMMSSA still has a role to play. Whether it continues to do so, will depend on the concern of our members - on or off the Management Committee - and their commitment and willingness to help us find new ways of addressing the plight and ongoing needs of disadvantaged children in Mauritius and Rodrigues.

The Pioneers Before COMMSSA

STOMA Care Nurse Education in Mauritius



From COMMSSA WA 2017-2019 to Curtin Mauritius 2024 and Charles Telfair Education 2024

Often, children born with a bowel or bladder abnormality cannot pass faeces or urine normally; a surgeon must create an artificial opening – a *Stoma* – which allows their excreta to go into a pouch. Without the supervision of a Stoma Care nurse, the stoma can leak, the children miss or even do not attend school.

In March 2017, Dr Serge Toussaint and Dr Mariam Bahemia, Medical Directors of COMMSSA WA in Perth, became aware that several children, whose surgery had been financed by COMMSSA, were in that predicament. They saw the adequate training of Stoma Care Nurses in Mauritius as a pressing need. How could COMMSSA make a difference?

Ostomy WA advised them to contact Mrs Elizabeth English AM, a Consultant in Stoma and Wound Care in Adelaide and a world authority on Enterostomal Nursing Education.

From 15-21 November 2017, Mrs Elizabeth English, travelled to Mauritius on a fact-finding mission, with Serge, Mariam, and Monique Malié, the President of COMMSSA and logistics guru of the operation. Mrs English ran a workshop in Stoma Care at Wellkin Hospital and ascertained that Mauritian nurses were ready and eager to undertake Stoma Care training.

In September 2018 and October 2019, COMMSSA funded Mrs English and Ms Sharon Boxall, a Wound Care nurse from Western Australia, to travel to Mauritius where they held 5-Day Stoma and Wound Care Nursing Education Programs at the Nursing Council of Mauritius, as well as workshops in Rodrigues on 30 and 31 October 2019. The COMMSSA team, who accompanied them, funded their own expenses, as they had done in 2017.



Although COMMSSA WA had taken the first steps, the full and ongoing education of Enterostomal Therapy Nurses would require the involvement of a tertiary institution. We, at COMMSSA, saw Curtin University, Western Australia, as best placed to do so.

In 2019, thanks to Mrs Jenny Dee, Australian High Commissioner in Mauritius, the COMMSSA team met with Professor Lina Pelliccione, President of Curtin Mauritius, on the Charles Telfair campus. We left Mauritius hopeful that, one day, once it became involved in health education, Curtin Mauritius would rise to the challenge.

COVID-19 derailed our efforts. That is until Ms Anaïs Ducray, a member of COMMSSA's Management Committee, on holiday in Mauritius in October 2023, contacted someone she knew at Curtin. A few days later, Mrs Monique Malié, Ms Anaïs Ducray and Dr Mariam Bahemia (online) together with Dr Odylle Charoux (Acting Head Health Sc faculty) and Mr Shafiiq Gopee (Head of the Office of Learning and Teaching) met at Curtin Mauritius.

On 13-14 February 2024, Curtin Mauritius (with Dr Sharon MacLean of Curtin WA at the helm) ran a very successful Stoma Care CPD workshop for nurses, in conjunction with The Charles Telfair Education. Stoma Care Nurse Education in Mauritius is now on track and on its way!

The training of Stoma Care Nurses will transform the quality of life, not only for dozens of children -COMMSSA's initial concern - but for hundreds of Mauritians living with a stoma.

We acknowledge the substantial contribution made by Austral Fisheries towards COMMSSA's, Stoma Care Project. They provided Taxi Transport for our team for the whole duration of our trips to Mauritius and Rodrigues.

Heartfelt Congratulations and **Thank You** to Curtin Mauritius for taking up the challenge.

COMMSSA Changes Lives!

Although Yonny and Marie Shelly, whose news we share today are now adults, they demonstrate the impact COMMSSA has had over the years and can still have on the lives of disadvantaged children from Mauritius and Rodrigues. And how timely specialist surgical and medical intervention can help a child, with life-threatening or disabling conditions reach adulthood and achieve his or her dreams and full potential.



A Life Transformed: Yonny Lapunaise's Story

Yonny was one of ten children referred by SACIM-Mauritius for surgery in Perth between 1991 and 1997, all requiring, and successfully undergoing cardiac surgery at Princess Margaret Hospital. The costs for their hospital stay, surgical procedures, and all associated expenses were fully covered by COMMSSA-SACIM (WA).

Yonny arrived in Perth in February 1997, just before his third birthday accompanied by his mother, Christina. They were hosted by Mr and Mrs René and Mrs Hélène Mak, who have remained in regular contact with the family. As a result of the surgery, Yonny has been able to lead a healthy and fulfilling life, just like the other nine children whose treatment was financed by COMMSSA during those years.

Yonny works as a boilermaker at the shipyards in Port-Louis, enjoys Boxing and Thai-Boxing and is looking forward to getting married next year.

Thanks to Mrs Mak, Tonny called me on Whatsapp on 4 April. It was a pleasure to see him and hear his news.

With Yonny's permission, we are delighted to share a photograph kindly provided by Mrs Hélène Mak. It captures a joyous moment - Yonny celebrating his 30th birthday, popping the cork of a bottle of bubbly in front of his birthday cake - joie de vivre! A true testament to the new lease on life he was given through the generosity and dedication of COMMSSA and its supporters.

A Journey of Strength: Marie Shelly Félicité's Story

At just 10 years old, Marie Shelly Félicité was sent to Perth by SACIM for urgent medical treatment. Suffering from multiple ocular, metabolic, and endocrinological conditions, she and her mother spent several months in Perth, where they were hosted by Monique and Jack Malié - affectionately known as Mémé and Pépé - by several families whom they have hosted.

Despite the best efforts of specialists, Shelly's right eye could not be saved, and she was fitted with an artificial eye. Since 2011, she has returned to Perth for annual or two-yearly medical reviews. However, these challenges never held her back.

Shelly's resilience and determination led her to successfully complete her secondary education. After graduating from school she applied to study at a tertiary institution and was accepted into Polytech Mauritius at Baie Malgache, in Rodrigues, where she pursued studies in Sport, Recreation, and Fitness Management.

In October 2024, she achieved a Higher Certificate in Sport, Recreation, and Fitness Management. She is now setting her sights even higher, aiming to obtain an Advanced Certificate in Sport Management.

Well done, Shelly! You are an inspiration and a true role model. Your perseverance and achievements are a testament to your strength, and you have our admiration - congratulations!



Les Plaisirs du Goût - For your tastebuds

Gâteaux Piments Recipe: From Jack Malie, Masterchef of chilli cakes!

Share your Favourite Mauritian Recipe!





1 cup yellow split peas (dhall)
3-4 green chilies, chopped (adjust to taste)
2 cloves garlic, minced
2 tbsp chopped coriander
1 small onion, finely chopped
1/2 tsp cumin powder
Salt to taste
Oil for frying

Instructions:

Soak the yellow split peas in water for at least 4 hours or overnight. Drain completely.

Grind the split peas into a coarse paste (not too smooth) without adding water. Add the chopped chillies, garlic, coriander, onion, cumin, and salt to the paste. Mix well.

Shape the mixture into small balls or patties.

Heat oil in a deep pan and fry until golden brown and crispy.

Drain on paper towels and serve hot with a chilli sauce.

Tarte à la Banane / Banana Tart Recipe From Monique Tourneur



Ingredients:

Banana filling:
500g very ripe bananas
100g sugar
Tsp of vanilla essence (optional)
Pastry:
200g flour
100g butter (cubed)
Pinch of salt
1 tbsp sugar
15 mls of cold water

Instructions:

Mash the banana with sugar and vanilla essence and cook over low heat stirring constantly as it will splatter.

When mixture is brown and thick remove from heat and set aside to cool.

Pastry tart for shells:

Add salt, sugar and butter to flour and using your fingertips quickly rub the butter into the flour to obtain a fine crumbed texture.

Make a well in the centre, add water and mix/knead to botain a soft dough.

Shape into a ball and flatten slightly. Cover with clinp wrap and refrigerate for about 30-60 minutes. Preheat oven to 200c

Grease 10 small tart tins with removable base.

Flour the pastry mat and roll out pastry 3-5 mm thick.

If pastry is too hard to roll stand at room temperature for a few minutes until soft to touch.

Cut out circles large enough to fit tins

Line tins with pastry, trim edges and add banana mixture.

Roll remaining pastry, cut strips ½ cm wide and length to fit tart tin and lay on filling in a weaved pattern. Brush with egg yolk and bake about 20 minutes until golden brown.
